

Who is Cindy and who are you? A workshop for children

Cindy Sherman is an American artist who works with photography. In most cases, she uses herself as a model and changes her appearance — as she does not want to depict herself but others. A photo workshop presented by Goetz Collection and Filomele - Die KunstKultur for children aged 10 to 14 years.

Cindy Sherman (born 1954 in Glen Ridge, New Jersey, United States) poses in her work as an actress in front of the camera: she dresses up, uses heavy make-up, wears masks and slips it into various roles. Cindy Sherman observes people very carefully: not only what they wear, but also how they feel. She then tries to portray this herself. Many of her viewers wonder who the real Cindy is and whether she is hidden in these pictures. This is one of the interesting aspects of photography, as the person portrayed can decide what they show of themselves.

You can get to the root of this method at the Goetz Collection. Here you can learn not only Cindy Sherman's art, but also — like Cindy Sherman — photograph yourself. Your work will be presented at the end of the current exhibition in the Goetz Collection.
